Siri does more than ever. Even before you ask. Just start by saying: Hi Siri!

Knowledge on the go

Siri has answers to almost all kinds of questions. Quickly check facts, do calculations, or translate a phrase into another language. It is as simple as just asking or commanding.

1. *“Translate happy to Spanish”*
2. *“Find information about freedom”*
3. *“Show me the map of Sweden”*

More powerful tasks

Siri can for example find photos of your kids or help you to remember where you put things.

1. *“Show my photos from Thailand from last summer”*
2. *“Open the presentation I was working on yesterday”*
3. *“Search Pinterest for photos of kitchens with white subway stile”*

Shortcuts

Siri Shortcuts show up right on your locked screen if you want. An all-new feature called Shortcuts makes the things you do often – like getting your morning coffee – even easier. Just tap the suggestions when it comes up on your locked screen or in your search results. Done!

You can add Shortcuts to the apps you use all the time. Shortcuts give you an even faster way to access apps. Say you travel often. Next time you create an itinerary in an app like Kayak, just tap Add to Siri.

You can personalize Siri to be even more useful like to choose to make Siri speak 21 different languages.

Security

Siri is designed to do as much learning as possible offline, right on your device. Searches and requests are not associated with your identity – so your personal information is not gathered to sell to advertisers or other organizations. And end- to-end encryption ensures that data synced between your devices can’t be accessed, even by Apple.
